Achievement Related to Academic Goals

At the conclusion of semester one, 22-23 school year, 84% of students have earned all credits. By grade level, the percent of students earning all credits is:

9th grade = 78%

10th grade = 83%

11th grade = 76%

12th grade = 98%

TOTAL = 84%

Additionally, 38% of current seniors are <u>significantly ahead</u> as evidenced by the fact that they have earned at least three college credits. The average number of college credits earned by those students is 13.4 credits.
